Health is more than just the absence of disease, but includes a harmony or wholeness of body, mind and spirit. This wholeness has a long tradition in Christianity as well as in other religions and cultures. Nearly one third of Jesus' ministry was healing and wholeness. Today, we live in societies that are broken in many ways despite all our scientific progress. Nearly 50% of our disease in the USA is avoidable by lifestyle changes. We have an epidemic of obesity, diabetes, heart disease as pointed out by the Surgeon General. As a nation and many as individuals, have been poor stewards of our bodies.

The Community of Christ Church has lagged behind many other faiths in developing the concept of Congregational Health Ministry (aka Parish Nursing). Although many of our congregations are small in numbers and professions represented, one does not have to be an RN or MD to be a promoter of healthy living. Responsible stewardship of our bodies will have a positive effect on the health of the people in every congregation. Health Ministry is the INTENTIONAL reaching out to others by the church to promote wholeness or health. This can involve numerous avenues of service depending upon the needs of the congregation and the community as well the skills of the local Health Ministries team. These can include education, pastoral support, counseling and advocacy.

2nd Annual Health & Spirituality Workshop

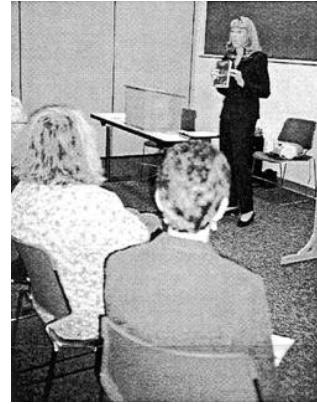
