STRATEGIC PLAN IMPLEMENTION

In October 2006 the HMA Officers, Board, and interested members met to develop a new strategic plan for the organization with the assistance of Roger and Kathy Revell of Revell, Inc.

After examining the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and challenges for HMA, the group outlined important strategic issues and began to prioritize these to create focus. The long term objectives for the 3-5 year time-frame then shaped our organizational goals. These goals are: organizational growth and development, domestic health and international health. "The strategic plan helps us focus on outcomes. How we have and how we can continually improve our ability to make a difference in all phases of our activities," states Howard Braby, HMA president.

To meet these goals, 6 standing committees were reorganized. These include: **Executive Board**, **Domestic Health** (school program, Health & Spirituality workshop, and congregational health), **Fund Raising**, **Membership**, **Marketing and Public Relations**, and **International Health**. These committees are creating action plans for the results oriented goals to be completed by spring of 2008.

The Bylaws committee is also actively reviewing the Constitution and Bylaws. They are recommending changes that will be approved by the Board at the October 2007 Board Meeting and then voted on by members of HMA this fall.

Jean Brookens is chairing the Fund Raising committee and has outlined several activities for the remainder of 2007 and 2008.

The membership committee under the leadership of Joy Weydert is looking at social events and other opportunities for greater membership involvement.

The international committee led by Bob Paschall is reviewing the policies and procedures for team leaders, participants, and the Guatemala program.

The "Shifting Realities" grant between Outreach International and HMA for Guatemala indigenous nurses training and participatory human development in villages utilizes outcome measurements.
