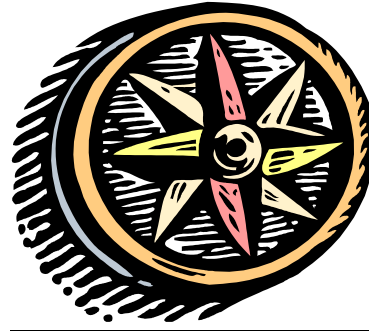

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS:

Joy Weydert, MD, FAAP

Dr. Weydert is currently the Director of Integrative Pain Management at Children's Mercy Hospital in Kansas City, Mo where her work focuses on the integrative approach to chronic pain in children. She recently completed a fellowship in Pediatric Integrative Medicine at the Univ. of Arizona in Tucson where she engaged in research studying the use of mind-body therapies and botanicals in children with recurrent abdominal pain. Prior to her fellowship, Dr. Weydert was in private practice in Cedar Rapids, Iowa for 5 years then worked for the Indian Health Service in Bethel, Alaska. She has a special interest in health promotion and disease prevention in children using an integrative approach to healing. She is also an ordained minister in the Community of Christ and feels this has contributed to her healing ministry.

Rev. Dr. John K. Swift

Rev. Dr. John K. Swift is the Director of Spiritual Wellness at St. Luke's Hospital of Kansas City where he directs a program of patient care, pastoral education, and staff support. He has been in hospital ministry for more than 34 years in hospitals in Toronto, Ottawa, Calgary, Hartford, and New York City. Dr. Swift is an ACPE clinical pastoral education supervisor and has supervised more than 80 units of CPE. He completed his seminary and doctorate in pastoral counseling at The School of Theology at Claremont, CA. and did residencies at Univ. of VA. Medical Center and Duke Univ. Medical Center. Fr. Swift is an ordained Episcopal priest canonically resident in the Episcopal Diocese of West Missouri.
