Hope in the Midst of Struggle: Jeanne Earnest, MS, Licensed Psychologist in private practice for 25 years.

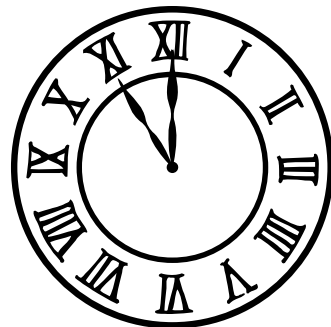
